Orchid Fever

Flower shows are in season across the country, with orchids, once again, commanding attention. Here, three ways to get an early sniff of spring.

TO BUY Your local nursery is sure to carry a standard-issue phalaenopsis. But you'll find more unusual blooms at www.hoosierorchid.com. Or head to Washington, D.C., for the National Capital Orchid Society's auction at the United States National Arboretum, on March 3. Rare orchids will be up for grabs, with starting bids at around \$10. For more info, go to www.ncos.us.

TO LEARN At the New York Botanical Garden's annual Orchid Show (www.nybg.org), the flowers wind









around tree trunks and branches (just as they do in the wild), and terrariums allow you to see two-millimeter-wide miniatures up close. Take the audio tour, also available on the Web site, for fun tidbits, including the mythology of the slipper orchid. Through April 8.

TO BROWSE Prefer your blooms on your coffee table rather than your windowsill? Pick up Harold Feinstein's Orchidelirium (Bulfinch Press). The master flower photographer focuses on some 100 orchids, including those above. Just beautiful. - MEETA AGRAWAL
